Let's examine why we The Church must continue to revisit this question:



Merciful Secrecy by Ruth Logan Herne. Another in the Miracles & Mysteries of Mercy Hospital series. Anne Mabry loves her volunteer work at Mercy Hospital, and she loves the relationships she's been able to form with the staff. So, when she learns that nurse Katie McNamara is unsettled by a strange sequence of events, Anne can't help but wonder if someone is threatening her. When Anne later meets Katie's grandfather, a retired Atlanta detective, and learns that Katie was adopted after her father testified against the mob, Anne and her friends set out to make sure the young woman is not in any true danger. When Anne sees a suspicious man hanging around the hospital, she wonders if he's waiting for Katie, or perhaps her doppelganger, Kitty Sue. Could there be more of a connection between these women than just their physical apperance? Is something sinister afoot at Mercy Hospital? And can Anne and her friends solve the mystery in time for an Easter celebration to remember?

Love Finds You in Miracle, Kentucky A novel from Guideposts by Andrea Boeshaar. Anything can happen when you live in a place called Miracle. Meg Jorgenson wants a fresh start, miles away from the city and a failed relationship. She takes a teaching position in the tiny town of Miracle, Kencucky, and vows to steer clear of smooth-talking men. Before long, Meg is smitten, but it's eight-year old Cammy Bayer who wins her heart. The young girl has spent much of her life in a wheelchair but firmly believes that God will heal her someday. Cammy's widowed father, Vance, has devoted his life to caring for his young daughter, and he is delighted by the attention she receives from her new teacher. But will Meg and Vance see eye-to-eye when it comes to an experimental procedure that might grant Cammy the use of her legs? Will they open their minds to the miracle of healing and their hearts to the miracle of love?

<u>Sunken Hopes</u> by Gabrielle Meyer. Another in the *Miracles & Mysteries of Mercy Hospital*. After endless grant writing, meetings, and red tape, Evelyn Perry has finally begun work on the displays for the new museum in Mercy Hospital's historic Angel wing. Among the aritfacts from the hospital's collection are antique medical devices and dozens of pictures, letters, and newspaper articles. Many museums around the area have even agreed to loan items to Mercy. But trouble starts when one of the borrowed items, a twenty-dollar gold piece that saved Lieutenant George E. Dixon's life at the Battle of Shiloh, is stolen! As if Evelyn doesn't have enough to deal with, her troubled niece, Shelby, comes to stay with her for a few weeks. When Shelby becomes the prime suspect in the theft of the irreplacable coin, will Evelyn and her friends be able to prove her innocence?

Mulberry Hollow A Riverbend Romance by Denise Hunter (Book 2). Living life to the fullest always requires sacrifice. Avery Robinson decided to be a physician after helplessly watching her mother lose a battle with a terrible disease. Now at risk of developing the same illness, Avery guards her heart from love. She's driven to protect her loved ones as a workaholic doctor in the tiny mountain town of Riverbend Gap, North Carolina. Contractor Wes Garrett is hiking the Appalachian trail, in memory of the man who died saving his life, when an illness racks his body. After an agonizing fifteen-mile hike to Avery's clinic, he collapses on her doorstep. He recovers to find himself in debt again, this time to a beautiful doctor. When he decides to help her renovate a rundown carriage house, the obstacles to their attraction sprout like weeds - starting with the woman waiting for Wes at the end of the trail. Will he be able to relinquish the debt he owes his best friend? And will Avery find the courage to risk everything

for love. The second book in Denise Hunter's popular *Riverbeen Romance* series explores what it might be like to live fearlessly and free.

Dear Ministry Partner,

Every year, hundreds of committed volunteers fill thousands of volunteer shifts. To us, the word "volunteer" doesn't capture the importance of the role they play at the mission. We know that to make a real impact, the energy and resource we spend must translate to what we read in Isaiah 58:10 - the extension of one's life to another. That's beyond volunteering. In fact, we recently completed a training for all Good Samaritans called just that: Beyond Volunteering. The thought of giving time to help a ministry is noble. But the most effective translation of that time is when it's spent with someone who really needs it. Dave really needed it. After decades of alcoholism, he became hopeless, homeless, and nearly froze to death one night this last winter. He testifies that God told him to come to Watered Gardens. And it ws here he met one of those incredible volunteers, Virginia.

"I'm not going my way, the Dave way, anymore. I did that too long and saw where it got me. I'm going His way and Watered Gardens has really helped. My care coordinator, Virginia, has provided so much encouragement. She's assured me that God still has a purpose for my life, that I have worth, and can leave my mistakes behind. We've had some really good talks about the Lord, his Word, his mercy and goodness. She actually gave me the Bible I read every day, and I'm grateful for God bringing her and so many good people into my life as I've turned it over to him."

Virginia went beyond volunteering. She loved and inspired Dave, meeting him where he was and helping him believe that, by God's grace, he didn't have to stay there any longer. Now he's five-months sober, employed, plugged into a church, and reconciled to his daughter. Thank you for your recent support of \$169.20. We'll continue working hard to ensure those vital relationships are established that open doors of hope for people lost in hopelessness.
